

Digital camera batteries

Digital camera batteries are specifically designed for each digital camera brand and model. You can get a complete line of digital camera batteries and compatible replacements for most digital camera. You can also use a digital camera battery finder tool that will guide you in choosing the correct battery and ac adapter for your digital camera online. A digital camera battery is probably the most important digital camera accessory.

Since digital cameras consume batteries very quickly, what type of battery you can use as an alternate? Digital cameras consume batteries very quickly. I recommend using rechargeable nickel metal hydride batteries, as opposed to alkaline batteries. NiMH batteries will give you more pictures per charge and can be recharged hundreds of times, unlike alkaline batteries. To help your new NiMH batteries reach their full capacity and performance, fully charge and then fully discharge it at least once every two to three weeks.

Here are some battery tips for conserving power. Limit the use of LCD and use the viewfinder whenever possible to frame a picture. And check the picture in the LCD only when there is a question of whether or not you got the shot. Rather than using the auto shutoff, manually turn off your camera. This will save a significant amount of battery power. When transferring pictures from your camera to computer, power your camera from the wall socket instead of the batteries. Thus it is important to know how you intend to use your camera and what type of battery it needs.
